Courses Acceptable as substitutes for the FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT For students with approved accommodation, registered and verified by CUA's Disability Support Services

1. In order to substitute courses, you must have received official notification in writing from Arts and Sciences that the substitution has been granted.
2. For the substitution, a student should choose courses outside the major field. In general, basic survey or elementary (100-level) courses should not be chosen for the substitution.
3. A course selected for this substitution may not simultaneously fulfill any other distribution requirement on the tracking sheet. See the Undergraduate Office for details.
4. The listing of a course below does not necessarily mean that it is appropriate for a particular student. Prior to enrolling for any course, you are responsible for checking prerequisites and other relevant requirements.
